EXECUTIVE ORDERS THIS WEEK INCLUDE:

- [EO 2020-145](#) - Safeguards to protect Michigan's workers from COVID-19 - Rescission of Executive Order 2020-114
- [EO 2020-146](#) - Temporary COVID-19 protocols for entry into Michigan Department of Corrections facilities and transfers to and from Department custody; temporary recommended COVID-19 protocols and enhanced early-release authorization for county jails, local lockups, and juvenile detention centers - Rescission of Executive Order 2020-119
- [EO 2020-147](#) - Masks

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE:

Governor Gretchen Whitmer signed Executive Order 2020-147, which reiterates that individuals are required to wear a face covering whenever they are in an indoor public space. It also requires the use of face coverings in crowded outdoor spaces. In addition, the order requires any business that is open to the public to refuse entry or service to people who refuse to wear a face covering, with limited exceptions.

CLIENT NEWS:

Microsoft's new Together mode in Teams puts your video chat in a shared virtual space.

In an attempt to make remote meetings less awkward, Microsoft added a shared virtual background concept to Teams.

Together mode is one of a handful of new Teams features that are aiming to help remote workers and even kids and schools overcome the intense distancing and difficulties of prolonged isolation. It's an experiment that Microsoft's Jaron Lanier, a VR pioneer and researcher and collaborator on Together mode, feels could help. Together mode was derived, in part, from VR research on how people interact with avatars.

2020 Election Guide

One US Senate seat is up for reelection this year, and that seat is currently held by Senator Gary Peters(D). US Senate terms are six years long, and elections are held every two years for a third of the senators. Senator Peters is a former Lt. Commander for the US Navy Reserve and was first elected in 2015. He is in a tight race against West Point Graduate and US Army veteran John James®.

US Congressional terms are two years long with elections held every two years. Congressional elections are not staggered like the senate elections, meaning all 14 are up for reelection. Including two open seats, which are currently held by Representative Justin Amash (R) and Representative Paul Mitchell (R). Both are traditionally safe republican seats.

Important Dates:

May 5th: Filing deadline for precinct delegates to appear on August 4th ballot.

May 27th: Filing deadline for legislative initiatives for the November ballot.

July 24th: Filing deadline for write-in candidates for August primary election.

August 4th: Michigan Primary election

October 23: Filing deadline for write-in candidates for November general election.

November 4th: Michigan general election.

Link: Since Proposal 3 passed in 2018, there is no deadline to register to vote in the State of Michigan. Michigan now allows Same Day registration. We always encourage voters to get registered ahead of time. A good place to start the registration process is the Michigan Voter Information Center and can be found at mvic.sos.state.mi.us.
