SOS TO MAIL ABSENTEE VOTER APPLICATION TO ALL ELIGIBLE VOTERS

Over 7 million of state's eligible voters will receive an application for an absentee ballot that will allow them to vote by mail for the August and November elections. Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson stated "by mailing the application, we have ensured that no Michigander has to choose between their health and their right to vote." The application will include a cover letter with instructions on how to sign up for an absentee ballot for the August primary and November general election.
